

PERIMETER AND ISLAND EXHIBIT GUIDELINES

All exhibits exceeding twelve feet (12') in height, whether a tower, pylon, or second story, regardless of whether people will occupy an upper area or not, must meet the following criteria:

- a) Drawings must be signed or stamped by a reviewing structural engineer indicating that the structure design is properly engineered for its proposed use.
- b) Drawings must be signed by an authorized official of the exhibit-building company, indicating that the structure is built in compliance with the details and specifications set forth in the drawings.
- c) Drawings must be available at the show site for inspection by NFMT Management, the installation/dismantling contractor, exhibit and/or governmental authorities during the time the exhibit is being erected, exhibited, and dismantled.
- d) All requests for free-form or island exhibits must first be approved by NFMT Management.

Signs, Hanging – Requirements – Island spaces only

No equipment may be attached to the ceiling of the Exhibit Hall or to beams or trusses unless approved by Baltimore Convention Center and installed by the official show service contractor. Show Management encourages ceiling-hung corporate identification for exhibiting companies occupying 400 sq. ft. or more in an island space configuration.
